It had started in the junior division and was now in the Second Division of the Federation competition in Sydney.

Ald. Smith said the club deserved the full support of Liverpool people and said he hoped to see it eventually become a First Division club.

He promised the full support of the Council in developing JaJrdine Park as the club ground. Mr. Whittam described soccer as the most international of all football codes, and predicted that it would eventually become the dominant code in Australia.

During the evening, Miss Mimma Rizzo, of Leichhardt, was presented with her prize on her selection as "Miss Liverpool Inter Soccer Club of 1967".

The ball was capably organised by club secretary, Mr. Mario Mura.

Mr. Mura thanked Mr. Andy Amalfi for his donation of \$40 to the club; Louie's Motors, of Lansvale, for the donation of a \$100 cup, and Brescila Furniture, of Cabramatta, for donation of a vacuum cleaner which raised \$80 in a competition.

The guests danced to some lively music by the Les Amigos orchestra and were served a delightful supper — including such traditional Italian food as pizza pie, salami and mortadella.
