THE QUEEN has honoured six people who have close links with migrants and Australia's immigration programme.

The list of honours, announced to coincide with the Queen's official birthday last month, included a knighthood for a former Minister for Immigration, Sir Hubert Opperman, now Australian High Commissioner in Malta.
