Mr. Dino Gustin:

Outline of campaign and reason for Mamma Lena's candidacy:

There are approx. 70,000 electors in Lowe of which 40% are migrants. Italians represent 17% of electorate i.e. approx. 12,000 Italians.

Italians have recently been confirmed as the model migrants.

Mamma Lena is known by all the Italian, community and by much of the other ethnic groups. She is also known by pockets of Australians.

She has been involved in community work over 25 years.

Her candidature should be treated as a testing ground for other Italians and migrants to succeed in national politics. Our chances of succeeding in getting Lena Gustin to Canberra are not high. However, we can expect say 7-10% of the vote which would indicate a solidarity amougst Italians rendering the Italian migrant a force worthy of consideration by any political party.

It will lead the way for younger men and women of Italian origin and make their chance of success all the more attainable.

Everyone in attendance agreed that it was worth the effort to try. The Lowe Bi-Election would be a good testing ground. Mamma Lean was the best possible choice of candidate for the Italian community to support.

Publicity

Would take the following lines:

- Letter to all Italian households in Italian, advising Mamma Lena's candidacy and seeking their support.
- 2. Newspaper advertisements in local and ethnic newspapers.
- 3. A festival March with floats and artists and music etc. Considered to be too short notice and may have to be abondoned.
- 4. T.V. advertisements.
- 5. Picnic with festival atmosphere and a plane above with Mamma Lena For LOWE" streamer following from the tail of the plane.

-- This too may have to be abandoned as time may not allow proper organisation.

Budget: A committee is organising itself to collect contributions. At this stage we can expect to raise about \$5000.

- 4. Lena Gustin our best representative.
- 5. Mother of Italians in Australia gave assistance at all hours.

Motto - "Mettete un cuore a Canberra" (Put a Heart in Canberra) as Canberra is definitely lacking heart.

Funds Groups of people headed by Mr Nick Scali have collected about \$6000. The amount has been spent on advertising in the Italian as well as the foreign newspapers- German, Yugoslav, Maltese, Greek, Spanish and Portuguese.

We are seeking the support of all migrants.

Advertisements have also been placed in the local papers.
